The Remote Jobs and Economic Development (RJED) program is creating 3,000 new jobs with good pay and conditions in remote communities.



This program has been designed by people living in remote Australia who want jobs that could be part-time, full-time or casual and are flexible around personal, family and community obligations.



The map shows you where these regions are across the country.



The program is creating jobs by funding local employers through a grants process.

It works by:

- Communities talking with employers about what jobs they need and want
- Employers applying for Government funding to pay for wages and buy equipment so they can hire local people
- Young people, families and communities benefitting from new, local jobs

Eligible employers can apply for a grant to help create new jobs in their community which will pay for wages and equipment.



Before they apply, employers and communities should talk with each other about what jobs are needed and what jobs local people might like to do.

Jobs could be to care for the environment, work in a shop, care for others, grow a small business or other ideas.




If you're looking for a job, have recently finished school or will be soon, stay connected with local employers to find out about new jobs in your community.

The Remote Jobs and Economic Development program is the first stage of replacing the Community Development Program (CDP) and will look more like the old Community Development Employment Projects (CDEP) which ended in 2013.





The Remote Jobs and Economic Development program will initially run over three years with multiple grant rounds.
