**The Remote Jobs
and Economic
Development (RJED)
program is creating
3,000 new jobs
with good pay and
conditions in remote
communities.**



This program has been designed by people living in remote Australia who want jobs that could be part-time, full-time or casual and are flexible around personal, family and community obligations.

People living or working in remote employment service regions can be a part of this program.

The map shows you where these regions are across the country.

It works by:

1

Communities talking with employers about what jobs they need and want

2

Employers applying for Government funding to pay for wages and buy equipment so they can hire local people

3

Young people, families and communities benefitting from new, local jobs

**Eligible employers
can apply for a
grant to help create
new jobs in their
community which will
pay for wages and
equipment.**



Before they apply, employers and communities should talk with each other about what jobs are needed and what jobs local people might like to do.

Jobs could be to care for the environment, work in a shop, care for others, grow a small business or other ideas.



If employers are successful in getting a grant, they can hire eligible job seekers into new, local jobs.

If you're looking for a job, have recently finished school or will be soon, stay connected with local employers to find out about new jobs in your community.

The Remote Jobs and Economic Development program is the first stage of replacing the Community Development Program (CDP) and will look more like the old Community Development Employment Projects (CDEP) which ended in 2013.



Like the CDEP, the RJED program will include funding for equipment to support job creation.

The second stage of replacing CDP is a new remote employment service.

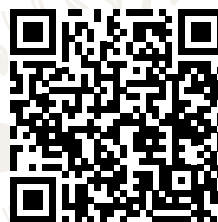


This will support people who are currently looking for work, or may need help to become job ready, to get the skills and resources they need to take up jobs.

The Remote Jobs and Economic Development program will initially run over three years with multiple grant rounds.
